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THE CELLAR OF BILL NUNNELLY: TO BENEFIT THE NAPLES CHILDREN & EDUCATION FOUNDATION AND NASHVILLE WINE AUCTION FOR CANCER RESEARCH

Bill Nunnelly was an entrepreneur, philanthropist, avid traveler, and lover of the finer things in life - especially fine wine and food. In his community, Bill established several successful companies after his start in the tobacco industry, and eventually ventured into the wine and spirits business, owning a retail shop for nearly thirty years. His passion for wine was evident in his frequent attendance at wine tasting events, especially in Naples, Florida and Nashville, Tennessee where he and his wife, Rosann, divided their time. They actively engaged in charitable organizations in both cities, advocating for the underserved through the charities that he and Rosann supported, and she continues to support to this day. As a tribute to his memory, one hundred percent of the net sale proceeds from Bill's wine collection will benefit The Naples Children & Education Foundation, and Nashville Wine Auction.

The Naples Children & Education Foundation (NCEF) is dedicated to improving the educational, emotional and health outcomes of underprivileged and at-risk children in Collier County through annual grants and strategic initiatives. The organization collaborates with 60 of the most effective nonprofits in the community to provide over 300,000 children with the resources they need to succeed. NCEF founded the Naples Winter Wine Festival, one of the world's most prestigious charity wine auctions, which has raised approximately \$269 million for children in need since its inception in 2001. This premier event offers intimate dinners featuring world-class food and wine, and guests are invited to bid on once-in-a-lifetime travel and wine experiences during an electrifying live auction. The exclusive three-day festival, ranked among the top 10 arts and entertainment events for wealthy Americans, attracts vintners, chefs, wine enthusiasts, and philanthropists from all over the world, coming together to support NCEF's initiatives with year-round impact on the lives of children.

The Nashville Wine Auction raises funds for cancer research through events that encourage generous giving from wine enthusiasts. This includes glamourous silent and live auctions featuring carefully curated lots of fine wines, exquisite trips, luxury items, and exclusive dinners and tastings. The organization collaborates with domestic and international wine communities, hospitality professionals, businesses, and individuals who share their goal of fighting cancer. Since its inception in 1980, Nashville Wine Auction has raised more than \$33 million for organizations whose purpose is directly related to cancer research, patient treatment, and caregiver/patient support. In recognition of his years of dedicated service and generosity, Bill Nunnelly was awarded the Norman M. Lipman award from the Nashville Wine Auction in 2021. He had attended the event for over four decades, serving as chairman in 1987.

This sale of more than seventy-five lots is a wonderful opportunity to support these important causes and acquire exceptional wine from the personal collection of this true connoisseur. Bordeaux leads the pack with ten bottles of 1990 Chateau Haut Brion and five bottles of 1989 La Mission, accompanied by magnums of 1982, 1986, and 1990 Lafite. Further exceptional 1982s include Latour, Mouton, Gruaud Larose, Calon Segur, Leoville Poyferre, Ducru Beaucaillou, and Leoville Las Cases. Burgundy from the 1990s and 2000s dominates, highlighted by J.F. Mugnier 1999, 2002, 2005, and 2010 Musigny and 1999 Chambolle Musigny Les Amoureuses!! Comte Vogue, Bachelet, Leroy, Dujac, Faiveley, and Engel follow close behind with finest red Burgundy, followed by a palate cleanser of V. Dauvissat Chablis and a toast of Champagne from Dom Perigon. Chave and Jaboulet from the Rhone, Gaja from Italy, and a Ridge Monte Bello California Cabernet represent the best from their respective regions in this generous selection from a lifetime well spent collecting the world's finest wines.

"A blend of 60% Merlot and 40% Cabernet Franc, this is clearly the greatest Angelus until the 2000, 2003 and then the perfect 2005. Beautiful, sweet plum, blackberry and blueberry fruit soar from the glass of this opaque, purple wine that still hasn't lost much in color. Deep, opulent, voluptuously textured, full-bodied and multidimensional, this is a stunner and just now approaching its plateau of full maturity, where it should stay for at least another 20 years." (99pts)

"It is made in a traditional style, so do not expect to get turned-on by lavish quantities of vanillin-scented, toasty new oak, and sweet jammy fruit. Although massive, with incredible richness and plenty of fruit, this wine is dominated by its blackcurrant, mineral, cedar character. The copious tannins are still present, but they are integrated with the wine's other components. This classic Calon-Segur is built to stand the test of time. From a half-bottle it should reach full maturity by the turn of the century and last for at least 20-30 years. This is a remarkable wine that should find many admirers among true connoisseurs." "I have noticed that both myself and Robert Parker have consistently given the 2005 Château Clerc-Milon a very respectable 93 points. At ten years of age (has time flow that quickly?), I find no reason to change my opinion of a truly great wine for the estate. The nose is straight-down-the-line classic Clerc-Milon with intense graphite and cigar box aromas infusing the black fruit that could only come from Pauillac. The palate is medium-bodied with powerful black and red fruit, hints of tobacco suffusing the multi-layered black fruit that gently grip the mouth. It has opened slightly since I last tasted this wine, though I would still afford it another 3 to 4 years in bottle. This is a great Clerc-Milon, probably the best ever made." (93pts)

Medium to full-bodied and beautifully pure with sweet tannins, this wine has aged more slowly than I initially expected. It is the finest Ducru Beaucaillou produced after the 1961 and before the 2003. With respect to the 1990, I do not own any of this wine, but it was the last of a series of vintages between 1986 and 1990 that were affected by the TCA-like contamination in the estate's chai, which was completely destroyed and then rebuilt, eliminating the source of these smells. Not every bottle is affected by this, but I do not have any source for this vintage." (96pts)

"A massive wine that is clearly of first-growth quality in this vintage, the 1982 Gruaud Larose remains a young-ster. A broodingly dense, thick, unctuously textured, inky/plum/garnet/purple color offers up scents of beef blood, steak tartare, cassis, herbs, tobacco, and underbrush. One of the most concentrated wines of the vintage (as well as one of the most concentrated Bordeaux's I have ever tasted), it is a huge, full-bodied, weighty, rich wine whose tannins are getting silkier and silkier. It appears set for another 30-40 years of life. This behemoth is a singularly profound example of Gruaud Larose that continues to justify its legendary status." (98pts)

The 1990 put on weight after bottling, and is currently rich, full-bodied, opulent, even flamboyant by Haut Brion's standards. It is an incredible expression of a noble terroir in a top vintage." It is a spectacular wine, and as it ages in the bottle, it is quickly becoming one of my all-time favorite La Mission-Haut-Brions, ranking alongside the 1982, 1975, 1961, 1959, and 1955. The 1989 boasts a dense, thick, purple color, followed by a sweet, roasted cassis, chocolatey-scented nose with whiffs of tobacco, tar, and minerals. The wine is extremely full-bodied, unctuously-textured, sweet, jammy, and rich. Although it is still a youthful, unformed wine, it is already delicious to drink." (100pts)

"The 1982 Lafite possesses a dark, dense ruby/purple color with only a subtle lightening at the rim. Spectacular aromatics offer jammy cherry and black fruits intertwined with lead pencil, mineral, and smoky wood scents. Powerful for a Lafite, this wine unfolds to reveal extraordinary richness, purity, and overall symmetry in addition to stunning flavor depth and persistence. The finish lasts for nearly a minute. The modern day equivalent of Lafite-Rothschild's immortal 1959 An amazing achievement!..." (100pts)

"The dense, opaque garnet-colored 1982 Latour reveals slight amber at the edge. Sweet, smoky, roasted aromas in the nose combine with jammy levels of black currant, cherry, and prune-like fruit. It possesses extraordinary concentration and unctuosity, with a thick, fat texture oozing notes of cedar wood, tobacco, coffee, and overripe fruit. Low acidity as well ashigh alcohol (for Bordeaux) give the wine even more glycerin and textural chewiness. The finishlasts forever." (100pts)

The tannins are still there, and, at least from my cellar, this 1982 does not appear to have changed much in the last 10-12 years." (95pts)

"There is no question that Leoville Poyferre was not making wines at the level of quality they have since 1990. That said, the 1982 is a great wine, no doubt because of the vintage rather than the winemaking at that time. A brilliant effort, it boasts a dense purple color as well as a sweet, flowery bouquet revealing plenty of creme de cassis, plum, and cherry notes, stunning concentration, a boatload of power, sweet tannins (the sweetest and easiest to taste among the St.-Juliens), and a long finish. Although close to full maturity, it has at least 20-25 years of life remaining." (95pts)

"The 1989 has taken forever to shed its formidable tannins, but what a great vintage of Lynch Bages! I would rank it at the top of the pyramid although the 1990, 2000, and down the road, some of the more recent vintages such as 2005, 2009 and 2010 should come close to matching the 1989's extraordinary concentration and undeniable aging potential. Its dense purple color reveals a slight lightening at the edge and the stunning bouquet offers classic notes of creme de cassis, subtle smoke, oak and graphite. Powerful and rich with some tannins still to shed at age 22.." (99+pts)

"...phenomenally dense and muscular It is immune to oxidation! Moreover, it has a level of concentration that represents the essence of the Mouton terroir as well as the high percentage of Cabernet Sauvignon it contains. Cassis, cedar, spice box, minerals, and vanillin are all present, but this opaque black/purple Pauillac has yet to reveal secondary nuances given its youthfulness. It exhibits huge tannin, unreal levels of glycerin and concentration, and spectacular sweetness and opulence. Nevertheless, it demands another decade of cellaring, and should age effortlessly for another seven or eight decades. I have always felt the 1982 Mouton was perfect, yet this immortal effort might be capable of lasting for 100 years! The fact that it resists oxidation is a testament to just how youthful it remains, and how long it will last." (100pts)

Medium to full-bodied, the palate is packed with tightly wound black fruit and earthy layers, framed by ripe, fine-grained tannins and lovely freshness making for a long, lively finish. Classic!" "This is still displaying plenty of wood spice and while it by no means dominates the otherwise spicy black currant, earth and ever-so-slightly sauvage suffused nose, it is not subtle either. There is lovely richness and a refined texture to the medium-bodied and solidly concentrated flavors that possess focused power and excellent depth on the impressively long and beautifully balanced finale." "The 2005 Charmes-Chambertin (from 80-year-old, tiny-berried, tiny-clustered vines in the core Charmes) is destined to become one of the benchmarks of this great vintage as well as of Bachelet's career. Too bad there will only be around 200 cases! A gorgeous nose of black cherry, blackberry, violets, rowan berry and licorice leads to a deeply black-fruited, expansive, satin-textured palate with undertones of bitter black chocolate, bitter-sweet roasted nuts, chalk, and iodine. (The iodine lends these black fruits a slightly medicinal aspect and what wouldn't this cure, I wonder?!). This Charmes exhibits amazing density and low-toned flavors in combination with lift, elegance and persistently engaging primary fruit juiciness. The carnal side of Pinot is entirely sublimated for now and the tannins so fine as to melt into the background. Save this for 2020 or beyond, please!"(96-97pts)



NECK:

Normal level for all wines. In wines over ten years of age, this level suggests excellent provenance. Rarely used, except to emphasize a particularly good fill level when other fill levels in the same lot are less than perfect.

BASE NECK:

A common fill level at which many Châteaux release their wine. For wines of any age, this level suggests excellent provenance.

TOP-SHOULDER:

Again, a common fill level at which many Châteaux release their wine. For wines of any age, this level suggests excellent provenance.

VERY HIGH SHOULDER:

Acceptable fill level for wines twenty years of age. Suggests proper storage conditions throughout its life. Natural occurrence for wines of this age.

HIGH SHOULDER:

Usually not a problem for wines thirty years of age. This level may be caused by easing of the cork combined with natural evaporation. Check the clarity and the color of the wine in the bottle as a secondary indicator of provenance.

HIGH-TO-MID-SHOULDER:

Refer to High Shoulder and Mid-Shoulder level descriptions.

MID SHOULDER:

May suggest ullage during the life of the wine due to either easing of the cork or inconsistent storage conditions. Not abnormal for wines forty or more years of age. As additional indicators of risk, definitely inspect clarity and color of the wine in the bottle, as well as condition of the cork.

LOW SHOULDER AND BELOW:

Suggests poor provenance. Definitely a risk and generally not saleable, with exception given to rare bottlings and/or labels. (Not recommended for consumption.)

Because the shape of Burgundy bottles does not allow for a level rating system based on the shoulder of the bottle, levels are described by means of centimeters below cork. Generally, Burgundy wines with a four centimeter fill level or above are considered normal for wines younger than twenty years. Wines of twenty or more years of age with fill levels of between four and five centimeters are generally considered to be of sound provenance, though consideration should be given to the clarity and color of the wine in the bottle, as well as the condition of the cork. Bottles with ullage between five and seven centimeters are not uncommon for wines forty years and older and often provide thrilling drinking, but the lower the fill, the higher the risk, so consideration should be given. Burgundy bottles with fill levels lower than seven centimeters may be at risk of being damaged or undrinkable, and therefore may be unsaleable. It should be noted that some Burgundian producers tend to over-fill their bottles during the bottling process which may cause a few drops of wine to become trapped between the capsule and the cork. This should not be confused with ullage, a natural occurrence in older wines, which may be accelerated due to poor provenance.

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
